HANDEL CHOIR OF BALTIMORE ANNOUNCES 2018–2019 SUBSCRIPTION CONCERT SEASON

Subscription tickets available August 1, 2018

(Baltimore, MD) Handel Choir celebrates transcendence in music during the 2018-19 season, under the leadership of their newly appointed Artistic Director and Conductor Brian Bartoldus. The three-concert subscription series includes works by Bach and Handel, Britten's enchanting cantata *Rejoice in the Lamb*, as well as one of Sir John Tavener's final works. The season will also include the Choir's 84th annual presentation of Handel's *Messiah: An Oratorio*.

"I'm overjoyed to be working with musicians of such passion, skill and dedication," said Bartoldus. "So much of our programming this year focuses on lifting us above our everyday lives. I trust the Handel Choir and our collaborators will not only rise to perform these works with integrity, but also connect with audience members in a way that will not soon be forgotten."

Handel Choir performs *Messiah* with a period instrument orchestra at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, December 15, 2018, and 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 16, 2018 at Grace United Methodist Church in the Homeland neighborhood of Baltimore and at St Mark Catholic Church in Catonsville, respectively. Noted among the acclaimed soloists is soprano Sherezade Panthaki, praised for her "full, luxuriously toned upper register" (*Los Angeles Times*) and "mining deep emotion from the subtle shaping of lines" (*The New York Times*).

On March 10, 2019, Peabody organist Jeremy Filsell joins the Handel Choir for *Heav'nly Harmony*, a tribute to the splendor of English verse. At the program's core is Richard Rodney Bennett's *The Glory and the Dream*, a virtuosic setting for organ and choir of Wordsworth's *Intimations of Immortality*. Other highlights include classics of the British choral repertoire, including Britten's *Rejoice in the Lamb*, as well as lesser-known works, such as Handel's first version of *As Pants the Hart*.

Lux Aeterna, Handel Choir's final subscription concert, presents diverse views of the metaphysical. J.S. Bach's *Christ lag in Todesbanden* tells of a grand battle between life and death, while Tawnie Olson's *Incantation* is a postmodern benediction informed by the folk imagery of her native Canada. The second half of the program features the music of John Tavener, including *Song for Athene*, famed for its performance at Princess Diana's funeral. The funeral anthem sets the tone for *Requiem Fragments*, heralded by *The Telegraph* as "the composer's late masterpiece" and praised by *The Guardian* as reaching "a level of sheer sonic beauty rarely achieved in contemporary music." This deeply intimate work blends excerpts of Christian and Hindu prayers, spread over three choruses, into one comforting whole.

A pre-concert lecture takes place one hour before each subscription concert and is open to all ticket-holders.

Season subscriptions will be available August 1, 2018: **\$110** for premium seating (front rows or center front rows of the venue) and **\$85** for standard seating. Full-time students with I.D. are invited to subscribe for \$25.
